Chair Burns announced Agenda Item 24-251: A Public Hearing for a Resolution of the Planning Commission of the Town of Erie Recommending that the Town Council Approve the Westerly Preliminary Plat No. 3 with Conditions and turned it over to staff.

Chair Burns opened the Public Hearing at 6:37pm. and turned it over to staff.

Aly Burkhalter, Planner for the Town of Erie provided a presentation and background of the project to the Commission.

David Frank, Director of Environmental Services for the Town of Erie provided additional background of the project to the Commission with regards to Oil & Gas setbacks and requirements.

The applicant team, Heidi Majerik of Southernland Company LLC and John Prestwich of PCS Group, provided additional information and background on the proposed project.

Chair Burns opened up the Public Comment for the agenda item at 7:06 pm. No public comments were taken.

Chair Burns closed the Public Comment portion of the Public Hearing at 7:06pm.

- Is the approval with conditions just for technical changes?
- Appreciates presentation
- Open Space/Trails is phenomenal
- Appreciates voluntary gas setbacks
- Is the school in limbo because of the oil & gas setback?
- Could there be a hold on the school because of the oil & gas pad setback?
- If St. Vrain Valley School District backs out, could there be more residential on that site?
- Widening of Erie Parkway responsibility
- Great job on the presentation
- Concern on the 264 units and road capacity
- There will be a capacity on the roadways surrounding this development?

- What did the Traffic Count Study account for (locations)?
- Is the north development going to tie in to this same location?
- Is there a need for signal for right turn out, left turn in?
- Signal concerns potential of the school
- How would you get from the school if you wanted to go West?
- Underpass and ditch is it problematic?
- Has there been conversations with FRICO?
- Intersection and sight line issue
- Limitation of larger building (93 ft/3 story) regarding school
- Parks/Open Space: Are they included in future plat or previous plat?
- Table/Chart clarification of parks/open space
- Agreement regarding drilling and three years is it written/documented? How binding is it?
- Appreciates the developer working with current standards instead of grandfathered standards

- Density guidelines Is there a height restriction?
- Land Use Designations and restrictions
- Statewide initiatives to reduce the zoning clarification (ADU's, HOA restrictions,
- Echoes the sentiment regarding staff's time at the booths
- Reviewing and commenting on provided documents outside of Planning Commission meetings, is that ok?
- Is there potential that we address heights and restrictions in the Comp Plan in certain areas?
