Lakewood	<p>Political/campaigning rentals allowed</p> <p>Open house style of political rentals allowed</p> <p>Cannot petition in common areas, must remain outside of building</p> <p>Can distribute political flyers, stickers, etc. in common areas</p>
Louisville	<p>Political/campaigning rentals allowed</p> <p>Open house style political events allowed</p> <p>Cannot petition in common areas, must remain outside of building</p> <p>Marketing materials cannot indicate City of Louisville sponsors/endorses rental</p>
Wheat Ridge	<p>Political/campaigning rentals allowed</p> <p>Open house style of political rentals allowed</p> <p>Rentals cannot market to patrons in the center</p> <p>Commercial activity allowed</p> <p>Rentals cannot compete with services/programs offered</p> <p>Cannot petition in common areas, must remain outside of building</p>
Foothills	<p>Political/campaigning rentals allowed</p> <p>Open house style of political rentals allowed</p> <p>No rentals related to guns - example: NRA, gun safety rentals</p> <p>Fundraising rentals not permitted</p> <p>Cannot petition in common areas, must remain outside of building</p>
Lafayette	<p>Political/campaigning rentals allowed</p> <p>Open house style of political rentals allowed, but must remain within room size limits</p> <p>No commercial activity</p> <p>Cannot petition in common areas, must remain outside of building</p>
Northglenn	<p>Political/campaigning rentals allowed</p> <p>Open house style of political rentals allowed</p> <p>Cannot petition in common areas, must remain outside of building</p> <p>In 1.5 years, he's never denied a request based on content - anything goes</p>
Boulder	<p>Specifically states cannot seek or collect signatures on a petition while in any facility</p> <p>Does not reference political/campaigning activity, such as an open house</p>
Commerce City	<p>No political activity in any public building including rentals; parks, gazebos are exceptions</p>
