### AIRFIELD PLOWING

Airport staff plowed the airfield twice in January. All appropriate NOTAMs were issued to alert pilots of the field conditions.

#### **NOISE COMPLAINTS**

Airport Management did not receive any noise complaints during the month of January.

#### **COMMUNITY RELATIONS**

Airport Manager Jason Hurd and his wife Rachelle are both very involved in the organization Pilots N' Paws. They continue to fly all over the country to rescue dogs, cats and other animals and bring them to Colorado for adoption. The latest trip was to Wichita, Kansas to rescue 10 cats. Those kitties will go Rezdog and the Cat Care Society for adoption.





#### DRONE (UAS - UN-MANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS) ACTIVITY



Airport Management and Airport Staff continue to receive an increase in notifications of drone activity within five (5) miles of the airport. While Airport Management cannot give permission for UAS activity in the vicinity of the airport, UAS operators are required to notify Airport Management of their intent to fly within 5 nautical miles of the airport.

The Airport Manager has recently been in contact with the Anthem Ranch HOA exploring the potential banning of recreation and commercial drone operations completely or limiting drone operations to commercial operations only through HOA Rules. UAS operations within the vicinity of an airport are a challenge for both drones and for full-size aircraft. The goal of Airport Management is keep *all* aircraft safe – both drones and full-size aircraft.

### **AIRPORT INSPECTIONS** – please see attached Appendix A for sample reports

Airport staff performed daily and weekly inspections of the airport. These inspections include but may not be limited to:

- Ensure all NOTAMs are current
- Check for FOD (foreign object debris). Remove as needed
- Inspect condition of the runway surface, and markings
- Inspect condition of the taxiway and connector surfaces and markings and Performing routine maintenance as needed
- Inspect performance of runway and taxiway lighting and signs and performing routine maintenance as needed
- Inspect performance of navigational lighting performing routine maintenance as needed
- Inspect condition of the ramp areas
- Ensure tied down aircraft are secure
- Inspect all airport equipment and vehicles and performing routine maintenance as needed.
- Inspect all airport wind socks for wear. Replace as needed
- Inspect segmented circle. Perform maintenance as needed

## **FUEL ISLAND INSPECTIONS** – please see attached Appendix B for a sample report.

Airport staff continues to perform daily, weekly and monthly inspections of the fuel island. These inspections include but may not be limited to:

- Physical inspection of tank exteriors, including fitting, valves, connections etc, for leaks
- Verify security of ladders
- Inspect tanks opening to ensure proper seal
- Inspect overfill prevention equipment and spill bucket
- Inspect tanks for contamination by water
- Inspect the area around the tanks for signs of leakage
- Verify fuel levels and alert Airport Management if fuel needs to be purchased
- Sump fuel tanks to check for contamination
