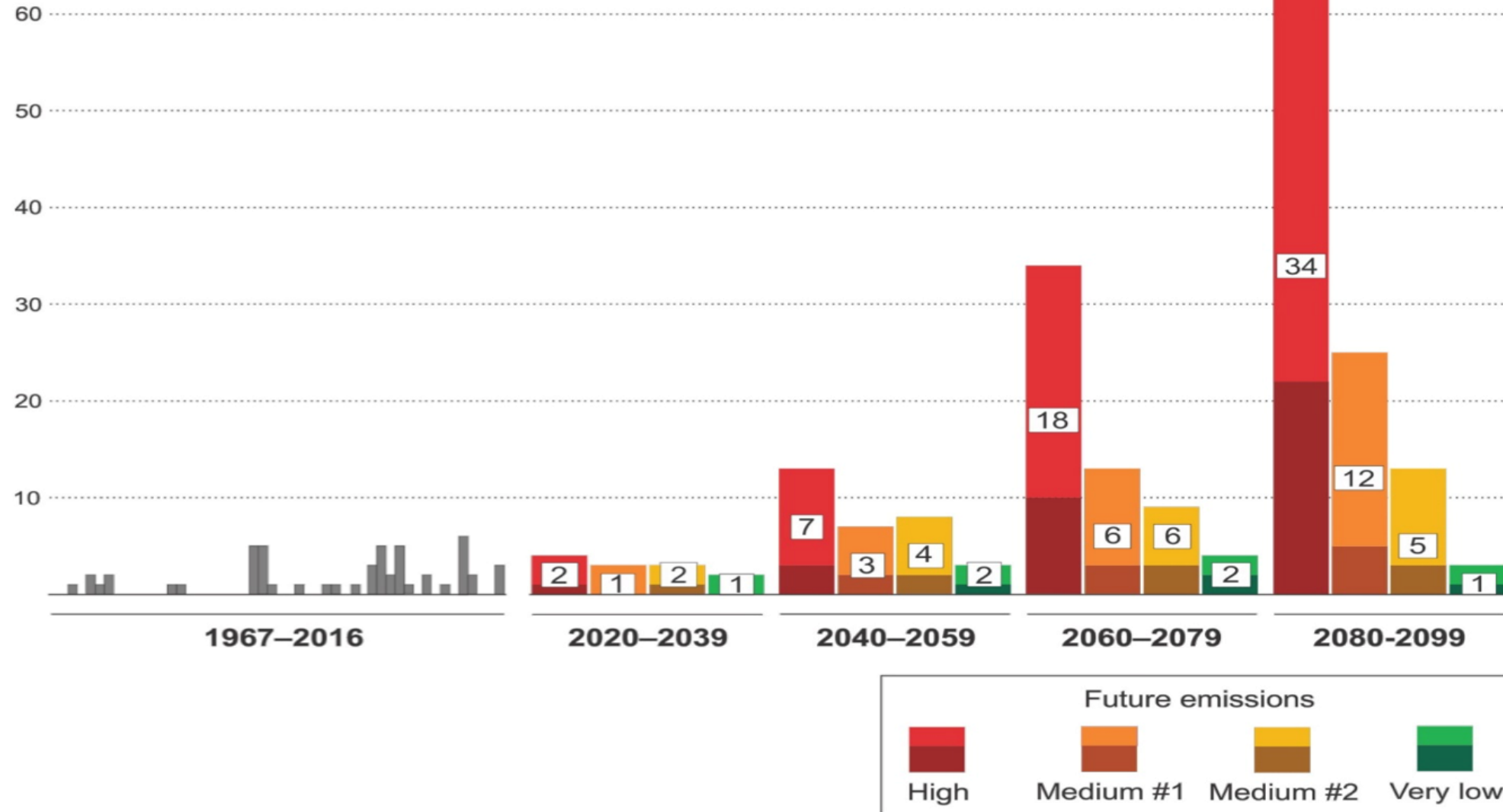

Impacts to Local Communities

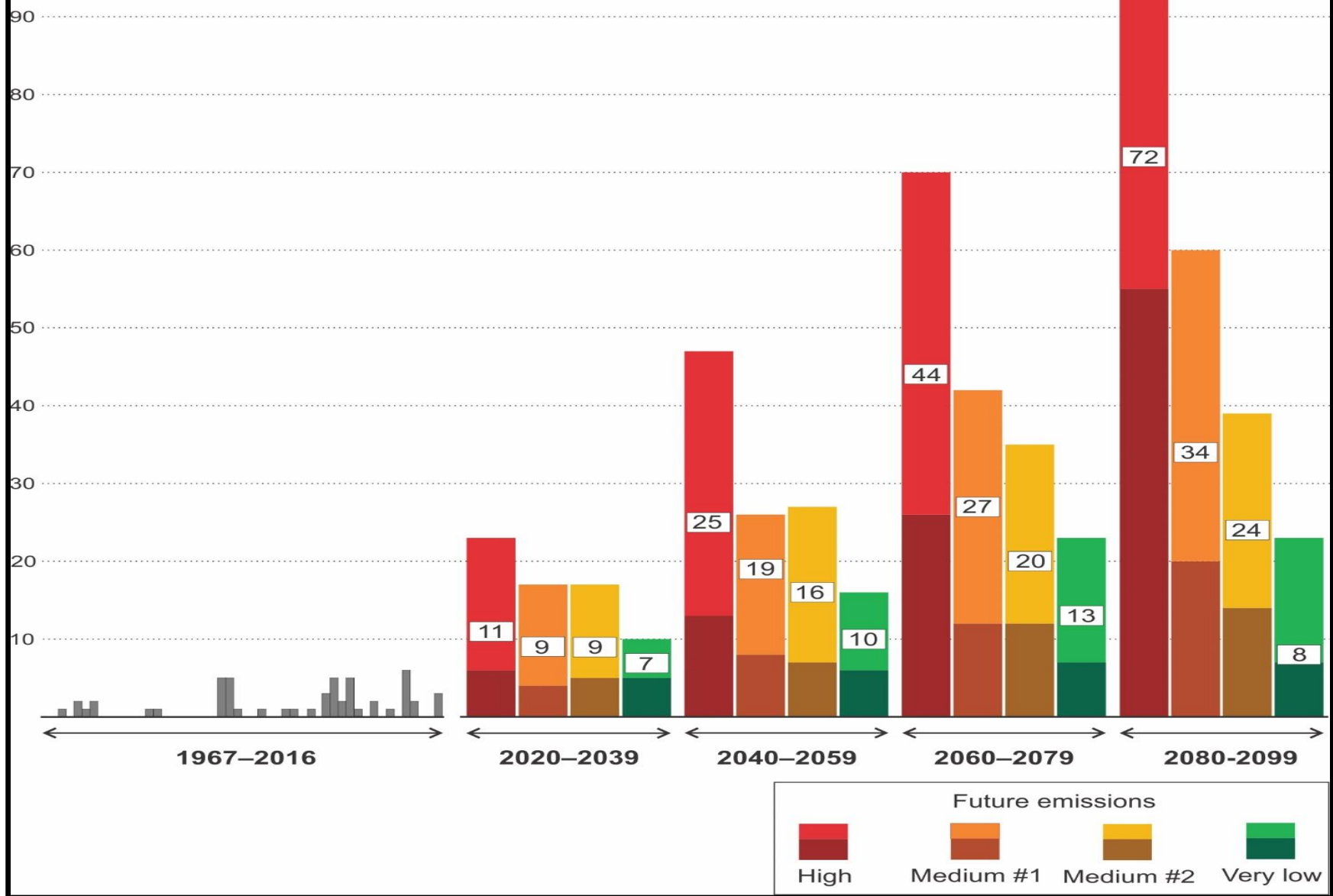
- Less water

Days 100° or hotter in *typical years*, Denver metro area


Projected averages for 20-year periods

2019 Policy Statement

- Reduce statewide carbon emissions
 - Secure accurate GHG inventories
 - Remove barriers for local climate programs
 - Enable electric co-ops to more easily purchase renewables
 - Expand energy efficiency
 - Reduce vehicle emissions and expand EVs
 - Minimize GHG emissions from drilling
 - Increase solid waste diversion
