Purpose: The Lafferty Annexation petition requests annexation to

the Town of Erie of a parcel of land approximately 39.665

acres in size.

The subject property is located along the southwest corner of the RTD right-of-way and the approximate location of the future right-of-way for Jay Road. The area to be annexed is generally described as being a part of the north one-half of the southwest one-quarter of Section 13, Township 1 North, Range 69 West of the 6th Principal Meridian.
