### **SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:**

Pride Month is celebrated in June to commemorate the 1969 Stonewall Inn uprising in Manhattan, New York. These riots propelled the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, and other identities (LGBTQ+) movement to a nationwide scale. The movement advocates for equity, legal protections, and the right to expression without discrimination. The first Pride event was held on June 28, 1970, to commemorate the uprisings' one year anniversary. This event came to be known as Christopher Street Liberation Day.
