<u>Second Amendment to Construction Manager at Risk Contract</u> (Police Department Expansion and Remodel Project (P24-519))

This Second Amendment to Construction Manager at Risk Contract (the "Second Amendment") is made and entered into this ____ day of _____, 2025 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the Town of Erie, a Colorado municipal corporation with an address of 645 Holbrook Street, P.O. Box 750, Erie, CO 80516 (the "Town"), and Fransen Pittman Construction, an independent contractor with a principal place of business at 522 Main Street Windsor, CO ("Contractor") (each a "Party" and collectively the "Parties").

Whereas, on August 26, 2025, the Parties entered into a Construction Manager at Risk Contract (the "Contract");

Whereas, on October 28, 2025, the Parties entered into the First Amendment to the Contract (the "First Amendment");

Whereas, the Parties wish to amend the Contract as set forth herein.

Now Therefore, for the consideration hereinafter set forth, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Section 4.02 of the Contract is hereby amended by the addition of new subsections C.1. and C.2 to read as follows:
- 4.02 For Phase 2 Construction Services:
 - C. In full consideration of early procurement items including, but not limited to, retaining wall, landscaping, and irrigation materials, subcontractor and vendor contracts, delegated design, and associated General Conditions costs during the Construction Phase of the Contract, Owner will pay to Contractor \$1,128,588 ("Early Procurement 2 Cost"). The Early Procurement 2 Cost is based on Bid Package 02 (BP02) proposal from Fransen Pittman Construction dated November 4, 2025, and is further described in the Exhibits identified in paragraph 2 below. Early Procurement 2 Cost shall be paid in accordance with the provisions of the Contract, including but not limited to withholding of applicable retainage.
 - 1. Early Procurement 2 Cost is based on 100% Civil documents and 50% construction documents dated October 17, 2025, from D2C Architects. The Early Procurement 2 cost is in addition to the previously authorized Phase 2 Construction Services not-to-exceed fee of \$10,364,616, as set forth in the First Amendment.

The Contract may be amended at a later date, following Contractor submission of BP-03 proposal, and development of a mutually agreed upon GMP.

2. The Contract is hereby amended to increase the maximum amount of compensation to \$11,553,204 allocated as follows, subject to the continued development of a mutually agreed upon GMP, as defined in the Contract:

Original Contract Amount: \$ 60,000 1^{st} Amendment: \$ 10,364,616 2^{nd} Amendment: \$ 1,128,588Total New Contract Amount: \$ 11,553,204

- 2. Section 8.01.A.10. of the Contract is hereby amended by the addition of new subsections a.2, c.2, d.2, e.2, h.2, and i.2 read as follows:
 - 10. Contractor Bid Package 02 Exhibits, attached hereto and incorporated herein:
 - a.2 Exhibit A.2 50% Construction Document Estimate
 - c.2 Exhibit C.2 Bid Package Buyout Summary
 - d.2 Exhibit D.2 50% Construction Drawings & Specifications
 - e.2 Exhibit E.2 Clarifications
 - h.2 Exhibit H.2 Recommended Subcontractors
 - i.2 Exhibit I.2 Schedule (Preconstruction)
- 3. <u>Remainder of Contract and Amendments</u>. Except as expressly modified herein, the Contract shall remain in full force and effect. No provision of this Second Amendment is intended to nor shall be construed to change or amend any provisions of the First Amendment.
