I was DISGUSTED when the town development personnel pulled a bait-and-switch on Bee's Thai Kitchen (the food truck attempting to purchase a plot to put a brick an mortar restaurant on Briggs, near Erie Parkway). That would have a been a family-run restaurant that would have added value to residents. We assume that the town's role in the collapse of that purchase was to extract more tax revenue from the plot for the development of some high-occupancy condos, which would not benefit residents, and would hurt the neighborhood feel of the area. An additional item I think would be massively useful to address in the next couple years (especially as additional population increases traffic) is to invest in constructing some form of pedestrian footpath over or under the intersection of Erie Parkway and County Line Road.
